DANIEL 6



The leaders decided to find a way to get rid of Daniel. They went to King Darius and talked the king into making a new law that could not be changed. For the next thirty days, no one in the kingdom could pray to anyone except King Darius. If someone broke this law, he would be thrown into the lions' den as a punishment. The leaders knew Daniel prayed to God three times a day.

When Daniel heard about the law, he immediately went home. He got down on his knees at the open window facing Jerusalem and prayed. The officials saw him praying and went to King Darius. They told him Daniel was praying to his God. The king was sad and tried to save Daniel, but he had no choice.

The officials placed Daniel in the lions' den. The king said to Daniel, "May your God, whom you continually serve, rescue you!" The king spent the night without eating, and he could not sleep.

Early the next morning, the king hurried to the lions' den and cried out to Daniel. He heard Daniel say, "May the king live forever." God sent an angel to shut the lions' mouths and they did not harm Daniel. The king was overjoyed and ordered to have Daniel lifted out of the den. King Darius issued a degree that all the people worship the God of Daniel.



God wanted him to do. King Darius (duh RIGH uhs)

planned to put Daniel in charge of all the land. The other leaders did not like this. The men went to the king and told him to make a new law (rule) that would not let anyone worship or pray to God. Anyone who broke this law would be put in the lions' den.

Daniel heard the law. But Daniel knew that the right thing was worshiping and praying to God. He chose to continue praying to God. The other leaders told the king about Daniel. The king knew that Daniel had to go into the lions' den. "May your God protect you," the king said to Daniel.

Daniel was put into the lions' den. The next morning, Darius rushed to the den. He called out to Daniel. Daniel said, "God sent an angel to shut the lions' mouths. They did not hurt me."

Darius was happy that Daniel was safe! Darius wrote a law for all people to obey God.





DANIEL 6

Daniel worked for King Darius. Daniel was a good leader. The other leaders were jealous. They watched Daniel and tried to catch Daniel doing something wrong. Daniel made right choices and did all the right things to honor God.

The leaders told the king to make a law that for 30 days people could only pray to the king. Anyone who prayed to anyone else would be thrown into the lions' den. The king signed the law; it could not be changed.



Daniel heard about the law. He went to his house and prayed to God, just like he did every day. The leaders saw Daniel talking to God.

The leaders told King Darius about Daniel. King Darius did not want to harm Daniel, but the law could not be changed and Daniel was put in the lions' den. "May God keep you safe," King Darius said.

Early the next morning, the king hurried to the lions' den. "Daniel," he called, "did God keep you safe?"

Daniel said, "God sent an angel to shut the lions' mouths." Daniel came out of the lions' den without being hurt.

The other leaders were jealous. They watched for Daniel to do something wrong so they could complain to the king. Soon, they realized that they would never find anything against Daniel unless it had something to do with his God. The leaders

went to the king and said, "You should make a law

that says for 30 days no one may pray to any god or man except you. If someone breaks the law, he should be thrown into the lions' den!" King Darius agreed and made the law.
