


PORT MINISTRY

LITERACY MISSIONS MINISTRY

"What dream do you have for your baby that will be born in a few months?"

"I want to read the Bible to her. I want to read the Bible for myself. I want my children to hear me read the Bible to them." Mario grew up in rural Mexico, two hours from the nearest school. Because he was not able to go to school, Mario did not learn to read as a child. He did learn how to work with horses so that is what he does today in Madison, Mississippi.

Mario quickly became friends with Beth at the stables. He told her that he wanted to learn to read. Beth contacted Ridgecrest Baptist Church's English as a Second Language ministry to ask about classes. Mario is now meeting with the literacy team at the church and is learning to read. Tears came to his eyes when he realized that he could learn.

Mario and his wife, Miquelina, have two children and a baby on the way. Mario and Miquelina work at the stables most all week, many times on Sunday. They want to hear more Bible stories like the ones they hear each week at ESL. Their daughter, Stacey, knows that Jesus loves her, but she's doesn't understand why He had to die for her. Stacey's ESL teachers have talked to her to help her understand. Pray that she will respond. Pray for Mario's family and many workers like them who can't always go to church on Sundays but are open to hearing Bible stories. Perhaps God is calling you or your church to reach out at a different time of week to meet the needs of people in your community.



Merea is an Old Testament word for friend or companion


