

PSALM 16-18 . . .



"A Miktam of David".

(miktam = ??)

Possibly: golden; secret treasure; pithy sayings

- Considered a "messianic psalm"
- Verses 8-11 quoted in Acts 2
- Verse 10b quoted in Acts 13

- David's <u>Confidence</u> (verses 1-2, 5-7)
- David's <u>Companions</u> (verse 3)
- David's <u>Commitment</u> (verse 4)
- David's <u>Christ</u> (verse 8-11)

"A Prayer of David".

(First psalm of 5 that is called a "prayer")

- Hear me (verse 1-2) .
- Test me (verse 3-5)
- Show me (verse 6-7)
- Guard me (verse 8-12)
- Deliver me (verse 13-14a)
- Satisfy me (verse 14b-15)

"To the choirmaster. A Psalm of David, the servant of the Lord, who addressed the words of this song to the Lord on the day when the Lord delivered him from the hand of all his enemies, and from the hand of Saul."


Fourth longest psalm in the entire book of psalms

- David's <u>Declaration</u> (verses 1-3)
- David's <u>Distress</u> (verses 4-6)
- David's <u>Deliverance</u> (verses 7-40)
- David's <u>Descendants</u> (verse 50)
