PSALM 24-27

Psalm 24

- A psalm of praise written by David directing the hearts of God's people to worship him in a manner worthy of who he is.
- Said to be an "entrance psalm" (2 Sam. 6)
- Also said to be an "antiphonal psalm"
 - Responsive reading
- Outline:
 - **God's Property** (v. 1-2)
 - **God's Purity** (v. 3-6)
 - **God's Presence** (v. 7-10)

How we are to come to God (v. 1-6)

How God comes to us (v. 7-10)

Verses 7-10

- Can be read with Jesus' second coming in mind (Ezek. 44; Zech. 14)



Psalms 25

- David wrote this psalm as an acrostic—each verse actually begins with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet.
- A psalm of repentance—"Penitential Psalm"
- Outline:
 - **David Prays for Guidance** (v. 1-5)
 - **David Prays for Forgiveness** (v. 6-22)

Psalms 26

- Psalm about being falsely accused.
- Unsure as to the background of this psalm
- Outline: 3 cries...
 - **"Vindicate Me!"** (v. 1)
 - **"Examine Me!"** (v. 2-8)
 - **"Save Me!"** (v. 9-12)

Psalms 27

- David is being pursued by his enemies.
 - He has been shut out from the Tabernacle...
 - There's also a parting from his parents...
 - He's being slandered...
- Circumstances seem to fit 1 Samuel. 19-22
- Outline:
 - **David's Praise** (v. 1-3)
 - **David's Petitions** (v. 4-14)
 - ❖ Three Requests:
 - The Lord's house
 - The Lord's haven
 - The Lord's help
