PSALM 24-27.



- A psalm of praise written by David directing the hearts of God's people to worship him in a manner worthy of who he is.
- Said to be an "entrance psalm" (2 Sam. 6).
- Also said to be an "antiphonal psalm"
  - Responsive reading
- Outline:

  - o God's Purity (v. 3-6)
    - God's Presence (v. 7-10)

How we are to come to God (v. 1-6) How God comes to us (v. 7-10

#### Verses 7-10

 Can be read with Jesus' second coming in mind (Ezek. 44; Zech. 14)



- David wrote this psalm as an acrostic—each verse actually beings with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet.
- A psalm of repentance—"Penitential Psalm"
- Outline:
  - David Prays for Guidance (v. 1-5)
- David Prays for Forgiveness (v. 6-22)

- Psalm about being falsely accused.
- Unsure as to the background of this psalm
- Outline: 3 cries...
  - "Vindicate Me!" (v. 1)
  - "Examine Me!" (v. 2-8)
  - "Save Me!" (v. 9-12)

- David is being pursued by his enemies.
  - o . He has been shut out from the Tabernacle...
  - o There's also a parting from his parents...
  - He's being slandered...
- Circumstances seem to fit 1 Samuel. 19-22
