Psalms 64

- Written by David
- Context: David running from his enemies (possibly King Saul).
- OUTLINE:
 - The Wail of David's Heart (v. 1-2)
 - The Work of David's Enemies (v. 3-6)
 - The Wonder of David's Victory (v. 7-10)

Psalms 65

- Written by David
- Context: Written just after David was crowned king.
- OUTLINE:
 - The Grace of God (v. 1-4)
 - The Greatness of God (v. 5-8)
 - The Goodness of God (v. 9-13)

Psalms 66

- Unknown author
- Context: (2 Kings 19) Assyrians taken over the Northern Kingdom of Israel
- OUTLINE:
 - A Call to Sing (v. 1-2)
 - A Call to Speak (v. 3-4)
 - A Call to See (v. 5-9)
 - A Call to Suffer (v. 10-12)
 - A Call to Sacrifice (v. 13-15)
 - A Call to Share (v. 16-20)
