Psalm 73

- Starts Book III (Ps. 73-89)
- Written by "Asaph"
- Deals with the question: "Why does the wicked prosper and the righteous go unrewarded?"
- OUTLINE:

 - A Different Perspective (v. 17-28)

Psalm 74

- Written by "Asaph"
- Psalm teaches us about failure and forgiveness.
- Written at the time the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem in 586BC. (2 Kings 25)
- OUTLINE:
 - Asaph's Confusion (v. 1-11)
 - Asaph's Confidence (v. 12-23)

Psalm 75

- Written by "Asaph"
- A "Thanksgiving Psalm"
- OUTLINE:
 - A Word of Praise (v. 1)
 - A Word of Promise (v. 2-3)
 - A Word of Preparation (v. 4-5)
 - A Word of Peril (v. 6-8)
 - A Word of Perspective (v. 9-10)
